

The Value of CDFM/CDFM-A

In January 2021, the Office of the Under Secretary of Defense released a <u>Policy Memorandum</u> announcing the CDFM[™] as one of five professional certifications that can serve as an "Alternative Professional Certification" to any of the three DFMCP certification levels. This exception to policy means you can now "present and maintain" the CDFM to meet any of the three DFMCP certification levels—earning the CDFM gives you a transferable, test-based credential that can be used anywhere in Federal service or the private sector!

Benefits:

- •OUSD(C) accepts actively-maintained CDFM or CDFM-A certification as an alternative to any level of DFMCP certification
- •The CDFM (to include the CDFM-A) is one of the DoDapproved professional certifications that the DoD Financial Management Certification Program "Recommends" at DFMC Level 2 and "Strongly Recommends" at DFMC Level 3
- •Marketable, recognized credential to prospective employers and clients
- •Earning a voluntary, professional certification indicates your level of initiative and distinguishes you from others in the field
- •Enhances your career and reputation
- •Certificates are listed on ASMC's website registry
- •New certificates are listed in the Armed Forces Comptroller (AFC), ASMC's quarterly journal
- •Shows growth and advancement within the profession
- •Pride at being a part of a prestigious organization that supports the profession
- •A beautiful, high-quality wall certificate displays your accomplishment
- •ASMC Chapter and/or on-the-job recognition
- •Certification maintenance requirements necessitate your continuing professional development and ensure that you stay current with industry trends and changes

ASMC Membership Types

Active Members

Persons who are or have been employed within the defense financial management field of the federal government or associated with it (contractor, etc.) and who, to remain in good standing, have paid the appropriate dues and fees. The new fee is \$50 for one year or \$120 for three years. The membership fee is non-refundable and non-transferrable and part of this fee goes to your chapter.

Lifetime Members

ASMC Lifetime members are recognized in the Armed Forces Comptroller once a year for their long-time support of the society. There are two categories of Lifetime membership with ASMC:

Lifetime Members (Non-dues paying – 30 years)

Any individual member achieving 30 (thirty) consecutive years of membership in ASMC qualifies for Lifetime (Non-dues Paying) membership, without any other stipulations. Non-dues paying Lifetime members do not receive a print copy of the AFC journal but can access the online version at any time. This revised policy was approved by the ASMC National Executive Committee (ASMC Board) in December 2016. Non-dues paying lifetime members also include members who are past National Presidents and who, to remain in good standing, have paid the appropriate consecutive dues and fees.

Lifetime Members (Dues paying – 20 years)

Any individual member achieving 20 (twenty) consecutive years of membership in ASMC qualifies for Lifetime (Dues paying) membership.

Retiree Members

Retiree Membership recognizes those ASMC members who are are "fully retired" and not working in any other profession other than occasionally doing "volunteer" work. Unless requested by the Retiree member, Retirees will remain dues paying members, in order to continue to receive a print copy of the AFC journal. (Retirees may request to be non-dues paying and receive online AFC access only.)

Corporate Membership

Corporate Membership is available for private sector companies interested in the military comptrollership field and have paid the appropriate fees. View pricing and benefits for corporate membership.

Honorary Membership

May be conferred upon persons making significant contributions to military comptrollership who are not eligible for, or who would not otherwise be expected to join, one of the other classes of membership. Honorary membership must be approved by the National Executive Committee, and has no fee.

Interested civilians should begin prepping their applications now. Once the application window opens, submit application package through MyVECTOR not later than Feb. 17, 2023. Late applications will not be accepted. Once the application is submitted, leaders must endorse packages by Mar. 10, 2023.
