President's Column – Continued



Required Financial Management Experience for the CDFM

Candidates must have the required number of years of defense-related financial management experience outlined below to earn the CDFM designation:

•Two (2) years if you hold an Associate's degree or higher; or

•Three (3) years if you do not have a degree.

If you do not have defense-related financial management experience, you must meet the following criteria outlined below to earn the CDFM designation:

•You must have four (4) years of Federal government-related financial management experience; and

•An Associate's degree or higher.

CDFM Testing Using the G.I Bill

You can receive reimbursement for licensing and certification tests (e.g., CDFM tests) you take on or after March 1, 2001. (MGIB-AD, VEAP & DEA beneficiaries only.) Effective January 6, 2006 MGIB-SR & REAP participants became eligible for this program. These tests must be specifically approved for the G.I. Bill. VA can pay only for the cost of the

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tests, up to \$2,000.00, and not other fees connected with obtaining a license or certification. VA will pay for tests even if failed.

House and Senate committees are not providing FY2013 federal civilian pay raise

So far, no House or Senate committee appropriations bills have included language or funding to support the president's proposed .5 percent federal civilian pay raise for FY2013.

The FY2011 Financial Services Appropriations bill set a two-year civilian pay freeze through FY2012, a move supported by the president. This year, the president's FY2013 budget calls for a .5 percent civilian pay raise. However, both the House and Senate Financial Services subcommittees have omitted any language on the president's proposal. If the final bill excludes pay raise language, it may be considered a de facto extension of the pay freeze for another year, a move that is popular in the House. Earlier this year the House voted to extend the civilian pay raise for another year and the FY2013 House Budget Resolution calls for a continued civilian pay freeze.

If Congress did not include any legislative language on the pay raise, the president would still have the authority to increase civilian pay. However, if Congress does not include funding in each appropriations bill for the pay raise, agencies would have to reallocate already scarce funds to pay for it.


National News
