
Membership

Your TV Is Spying on You

Political messaging is moving back to the living room. After an election in which Internet tactics seemed to captivate the public, political strategists are turning their attention to television advertising. As more people ditch their traditional set-top boxes for online options like Netflix, Americans are actually watching more TV than they used to. In 2012, the average household spent almost 3 hours per day watching television.

Quality content is partly behind the surge. So is our growing appetite for binge-watching. But, behavioral data has the biggest potential to keep our eyes glued to the screen. As a result, our television-watching habits will come to the aid of political campaigns in the next electoral cycle.

Republican strategist Sara Fagen states, "There's going to be a marriage of the digital and the television, and that's going to be the future.... Republicans have an opportunity not just to catch the Democrats, but to leapfrog them."

Current technology can determine how many people on Netflix skip the credits, replay certain scenes, or abandon other episodes midway through. That information provides a general idea of people's activities on the service. But it can't tell you, whether a viewer hit "pause" out of diminishing interest or because they needed more popcorn.

Fagen thinks Microsoft Kinect—the motion-activated video-game controller for Xbox—could combine its facial-recognition and motion-sensing abilities with a Netflix-like data-gathering operation. She feels it would provide a pretty impressive viewer-feedback system. Were your targets in the room the moment your ad aired? Were they were actually watching, or were they distracted and had their heads turned away from the screen?

This technology is obviously creepy. Then again, consumers put up with a lot of commercial behavior-tracking already; this could become another extension of it. Actually getting online databases to talk to real-world sensors will be another challenge... perhaps by 2020, something like it might exist.

Central to that future are mobile devices, which will allow people to control their thermostats, locks, refrigerators, and other appliances over the Web. Political advertisers are salivating over the idea, because it provides even more opportunities to talk to voters.

Your TV Is Spying on You

People are always on the move, and they're consuming their media in many places and in many contexts. This concept provides for a multilayered approach that ensures you reach each voter you care about, and in multiple ways.

Recently an ad campaign targeted the mobile devices of people within a 5-mile radius of the Kentucky Derby—a brilliant tactic. Targeting a particular demographic only gets you so close to the voter you're looking for. Add in a specific time and place where you know your targets will be, and you may as well be standing right next to them.

Political campaigns would benefit greatly from communicating the same person who shifts from tablet to phone to laptop and back again. Such sustained "conversations" with voters over time yields far greater benefits to a campaign than a single interaction does. Bringing digital strategy to TV advertising marks the first step of that process.
