Happy New Year! I hope that everyone had, in the words of one of my former wing commanders, a fiscally prudent and conservative (and successful!) closeout. Now that it's complete, we turn our attention to FY13.

The FY13 DoD Budget Request provides \$525.4B, a reduction of \$5.2B from the FY12 enacted level and reflects the Administration's efforts to make tough cuts and realize savings. According to the FY2013 Budget Request Overview, the major themes of this year's budget will be:


- More Disciplined Use of Resources
- Strategy-Driven Changes in Force Structure and Modernization
- Supporting the All-Volunteer Force
- Overseas Contingency Operations

The More Disciplined Use of Resources component of the FY13 proposal fits neatly the cultural change discussion we've been having recently. It acknowledges that the DoD will not be able to meet budget reductions simply through efficiencies. It will require the elimination of duplication, the tightening of personnel costs. enhancement of contract competition, and the reevaluation of modernization programs. It's a simple fact of life that some programs and missions will have to be eliminated that are not prioritized highly enough in the big "rack and stack" at the highest levels of the DoD. What's the takeaway for us as budgeteers and resource managers? There are many, such as:

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

- Reduce the cost of doing business by eliminating waste and unnecessary products and services
 - Constantly be on the lookout for best practices that can be replicated in your agency
 - Communicate successes in process improvement and cost reduction or elimination
 - Educate leadership about what is no longer affordable

I've said it before, and I'll say it again: DoD financial managers are mission-critical to national security. The improvements we make today in how our agencies procure goods and services, manage its scarce resources, and account for its assets, may make the difference between the success or failure of our warfighters. We've never been more greatly relied upon or needed. And I look forward to making a difference with you this next fiscal year.

Obama makes pay freeze extension official

Obama makes pay freeze extension official

President Obama has signed a six-month government spending measure that includes an extended pay freeze for federal employees and members of Congress.

As expected, lawmakers passed a \$1.047 trillion continuing resolution in September that funds the government through March 27, 2013. The stopgap spending measure ensures feds, already working under a two-year pay freeze, will not see a salary bump until April at the earliest. President Obama in August recommended a 0.5 percent pay raise for federal workers in 2013 but not until Congress passes a budget, effectively extending the freeze that took effect in January 2011. Individual employees still remain eligible for raises if they receive promotions, step increases or performance awards.

Federal employee unions have criticized the move to extend the across-the-board federal civilian salary freeze and are calling on the White House and Congress to make any pay raise approved next year retroactive to Jan. 1, 2013.

The continuing resolution is necessary to avoid a government shutdown on Sept. 30. It sets fiscal 2013 funding at the level mandated by the 2011 Budget Control Act, keeping spending at the current rate for agencies and federal programs with an across-the-board increase of 0.6 percent over the base rate for a total of \$1.047 trillion.

The CR provides \$88.5 billion in war-related funding, as well as additional money for wildfire suppression efforts at the Interior Department and Forest Service, and a funding boost for the Veteran Affairs Department to handle an increase in disability claims. The measure also gives Customs and Border Protection, part of the Homeland Security Department, some flexibility to shift funds internally to maintain current staffing levels for CBP officers and Border Patrol agents. The bill provides \$6.4 billion for the Federal Emergency Management Agency's Disaster Relief Fund, the same amount as last year.
