She is responsible for planning and directing Air Force budget formulation and execution of appropriations totaling more than \$160 billion annually. Ms. Gleason leads a staff of civilian and military financial managers who develop, defend and execute funding that supports military operations and Air Force priorities at the direction of Congress, the Secretary of Defense and the Secretary of the Air Force.

Ms. Gleason began her career in 1986 at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base as a financial management trainee at the Aeronautical Systems Center. During her career, she has managed both appropriated dollars and revolving funds. She has served at base level, in several program offices, on both product and logistics center staffs and at Headquarters U.S. Air Force. She assumed her current position in July 2015.
